



What is ZEBRA?

The **Zero Emission Bus Resource Alliance (ZEBRA)** is a professional association for transit agencies in the U.S. and Canada to share lessons learned about zero-emission buses (ZEBs).

ZEBRA is a group of transit leaders exchanging information without the involvement of manufacturers or outside groups. Since 2015, the association has been providing members access to peer information and shared research.

A Diverse Group of Peers

ZEBRA represents the collective voice of 80+ transit agencies.

Our members represent:

- 1,200+ ZEBs deployed
- 400 ZEBs in procurement
- 6 hydrogen refueling stations (and 7 more coming soon!)

Engagement Opportunities

Hydrogen Workgroup

The California-established national Hydrogen Workgroup is comprised of 30+ agencies that meet on a bi-monthly basis. The Workgroup aims to increase hydrogen knowledge sharing, provide resources for members, prioritize emerging technologies, and influence the hydrogen market for successful deployments.

Virtual Coffee Breaks

ZEBRA hosts four coffee breaks annually. Topics in 2025 included:

- ZEB industry needs, pain points, and lessons learned (February)
- FCEB hydrogen fueling solutions for **smaller** fleets (June)
- FCEB hydrogen fueling solutions for **larger** fleets (August)

Event Spotlight

2025 Innovations in Zero-Emission Transit Roundtable:

ZEBRA, in partnership with member agency, Mountain Line in Missoula, MT, hosted an innovations-focused roundtable in May.

Day one was focused on emerging companies using real-world data to tackle ZEB challenges. Day two highlighted bus OEMs and the expanding market. Ten vendors/sponsors and 21 agencies convened for the event, which included a site tour of Mountain Line's facilities and nearly 90% battery-electric fleet.
